### **1. Purpose of the report**

This paper sets out delivery plans and next steps for two commitments in the Police and Crime Plan – A green and pleasant county and A compassionate approach. It outlines next steps for their implementation, including the need for funding and resources.

### **2. Background**

In addition to its six priorities, the Police and Crime Plan 2017 – 21 identifies two new areas that the Police and Crime Commissioner wishes to see implemented in Gloucestershire. These are his commitments to A Green and pleasant county and A compassionate approach. A delivery plan has been drawn up for each one and both accompany this report.

It has been agreed within the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner (OPCC) that these two new commitments will be treated in the same way as the six priorities. This will mean a budget being identified within The Commissioner's Fund and a number of activities undertaken – and reported on within a quarterly performance framework – to support the delivery plans. The Constabulary has agreed that it will identify a police lead for each to undertake activities and evidence progress.

### **3. Recommendation(s)**

- 1) That the delivery plans are approved so that they can be launched and implemented
- 2) That funding for the delivery plans and actions within them is available through the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner
- 3) That the Constabulary identifies a police lead for each delivery plan.

### **4. Financial and resource implications**

A budget will be identified within The Commissioner's Fund. Internal or external groups of people contributing to the Plan will be able to bid for funding towards their activities. Initially, the delivery plans will be led by the Head of Public Affairs in her role with the OPCC, with police leads supporting her.

### **5. Risk assessment**

Following the meeting of the PCC's Governance Board, the Head of Public Affairs will discuss this and take advice from the Head of Governance and Compliance.

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**6. Equality & Diversity impact assessment**

I do not believe there will be any negative impact on people from protected groups but this will be monitored.

**7. Environmental impact assessment**

If the delivery plans are successfully implemented, they should have a positive impact on the environment.

**8. Consultation**

There has been some consultation but more will be done as the delivery plans are progressed


