Subject: Child Protection Intelligent Analytics funding submission - UPDATE

### **Executive summary:**

Further to the paper submitted at the June Constabulary Governance Board seeking funding in support of the Child Protection Intelligent Analytics (CPIA) Extension Project, this paper seeks to provide an update around revised costs.

Following further negotiation a discount to proposed costs has been arranged on the basis of the following terms as follows:

- Sole Supplier commitment to contract as sole supplier for the provision of an operational pilot
- Fixed term period for discounted licence BAE will provide a discounted licence for a set period of two years from the commencement date of the project (which will be confirmed in the contract). After this period, a term licence fee would be incurred if you chose to extend this operational pilot into a production service.
- Case Study agreement to co-develop a written co-branded case study and video for internal and external usage
- Customer References where practical to commit to co-present at one conference per year and host maximum of four customer reference calls/meetings per year.

The new pricing offer is:

Software product configuration – £200,000 Licence – £0 (discounted by BAE) Support and Maintenance – £50,000 (£25,000 p/a for a period of two years)

Database Development / Analyst (SO2 + MFF 8 months total) £26,885

#### **Total BAE price = £276,885**

Total figure to be split 50/50 with our partners from Gloucestershire County Council who have given an 'in principle' agreement to support this project.

This paper therefore seeks to update the Office of Police and Crime Commissioner that

having renegotiated reduced costs there will be a saving of £19,500.

Revised figure therefore £138,442 one off funding cost in 2018/19.

This proposal was considered at WEB Monday 30 July 2018 and a decision was made to approve funding subject to PCC approval.

PCC Martin Surl gave approval to support this funding on Friday 3 August 2018.

## Recommendation:

That the PCC note the decision to support this one off 'in year' funding cost of £138,442 to underwrite 50% of costs associated with Phase 2 of the Child Protection Intelligent Analytics project.
